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Administrator's Statement 89th Regular Session, Agency Submission, Version 1 Automated Budget and Evaluation System of Texas (ABEST)

#### 75A Sam Houston State University College of Osteopathic Medicine

Founded in 2019, the Sam Houston State University (SHSU) College of Osteopathic Medicine (SHSU-COM) is dedicated to preparing students for the Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree, which emphasizes a holistic and hands-on approach to patient care. Accredited by the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) and by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), SHSU-COM operates in a state of the art, five-story facility, demonstrating SHSU's commitment to enhancing healthcare access across Texas.

In 2023-2024 academic year, SHSU-COM enrolled 646 students, with 160 of 162 matriculants being Texans. The college plays a pivotal role in rural healthcare by focusing on primary care and rural practice. Its mission is to cultivate competent and compassionate physicians who are prepared for graduate medical education and dedicated to serving Texas through patient-centered care. By recruiting talented individuals from areas where they are likely to return and establish their practices, SHSU-COM significantly contributes to increasing primary care across rural Texas.

During the 88th Regular Legislative Session, SHSU-COM received \$38 million in funding through the health-related institution formulas. This crucial support allowed the university to reduce tuition by more than half, aligning costs with other public medical schools in Texas. This funding underscores the importance of state support for public universities, and SHSU deeply appreciates the substantial investments made to ensure affordability, student access, and student success. In addition, the complexity of our building and infrastructure requirements, coupled with the growth of our student population, Higher Education Funds (HEF) are a vital means of support to address maintenance, deferred maintenance, and ensure a safe and conducive learning environment for Texas Students.

The College of Osteopathic Medicine achieved remarkable milestones in the 2023-2024 academic year, including the graduation of its inaugural class of Bearkat medical doctors. The first cohort achieved a 97.1% first-time pass rate on their Level 1 board exams, and the second class achieved an impressive 99% first-time pass rate. The Class of 2024 achieved a 100% residency placement rate following the National Residency Match Program. SHSU-COM also received a decade-long accreditation from COCA with "exceptional outcomes" and no findings, a rare and prestigious accomplishment for a new osteopathic medical school.

In alignment with its mission, 58% of the Class of 2024 will remain in Texas for their residency, and 62% are pursuing primary care specialties. This focus helps address the critical shortage of primary care doctors in rural and underserved communities, where there is just one primary care physician for every 4,500 people.

#### **Request for Mission Specific Support**

Currently, Texas supports 14 health-related institutions, with mission-specific formula support provided to 10 of these institutions. SHSU-COM is one of the few institutions that does not receive such support. To enhance its ability to serve rural and underserved Texas patients, SHSU-COM respectfully requests mission-specific clinical support.

SHSU-COM's primary care clinic in Conroe offers exceptional multispecialty care, but what sets it apart is its distributed model of medical education through the Sam Houston Regional Education Consortium for Graduate Medical Education. This model immerses student doctors in rural communities where they integrate into local practices and contribute to the community both professionally and economically.

Given the critical need for healthcare infrastructure in rural areas, where hospitals and private practitioners face significant financial challe **QGM Shappe** chi is vital. We request clinical mission-specific support of \$150 per patient visit in the SHSU Physician's Clinic and visits conducted by residents through the Sam Houston Regional Education Consortium. This support would be approximately \$35,000,000 for the 2026-2027 biennium.

## (2) Mission:

Funds from this Special Item are transferred to operations in support of enhancement strategies that focus on academic programming and initiatives, student success, workforce development, and infrastructure needs. These funds have provided the flexibility needed to respond to environmental factors and shifts.

## (3) (a) Major Accomplishments to Date:

• SHSU College of Osteopathic Medicine (SHSU-COM) was launched in 2020 with a mission to prepare students for the degree of Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine with an emphasis on primary care, rural, and underserved practice.

• The inaugural class 669 graduated on May 9, 2024.

• The inaugural class achieve @72% first-time pass rate on the national board examinations, placing it as one of the top three Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine in the country.

• The inaugural class had a 100% placement rate into residency with 62% entering primary care fields and 58% remaining in Tegrazdioatedtstining.

• The Class o2025 achieved a 99% first-time pass rate on the board exam, which will likely strengthen the standing of the COM.

• In April 2024, SHSU-COM was granted full 10-year accreditation with exceptional outcomes.

• SHSUCOM is recognized as the most affordable osteopathic medical school in the nation based on total cost of attendance.

(3) (b) Major Accomplishments Expected During the Next 2 Years:

- Development of 3-4 new residency training programs focused on primary care and psychiatry in areas of need
- Expansion of physician preceptor network from around 1000 to 1500 or more in the next 2 years
- Addition of 2-3 new clinical 'Regions" for training 3rd and 4th year student doctors in community-based and rural settings (we currently have 7)

• Development of a dual degree program in business (DO-MBM)Acupuncture (DO-MS in Acupunct) in addition to the new DO-MPH program launching this year

- Development of a Rural Medicinerack with a Center for Rural Healthcare (or something similar) to assist rural hospitals and physicians
